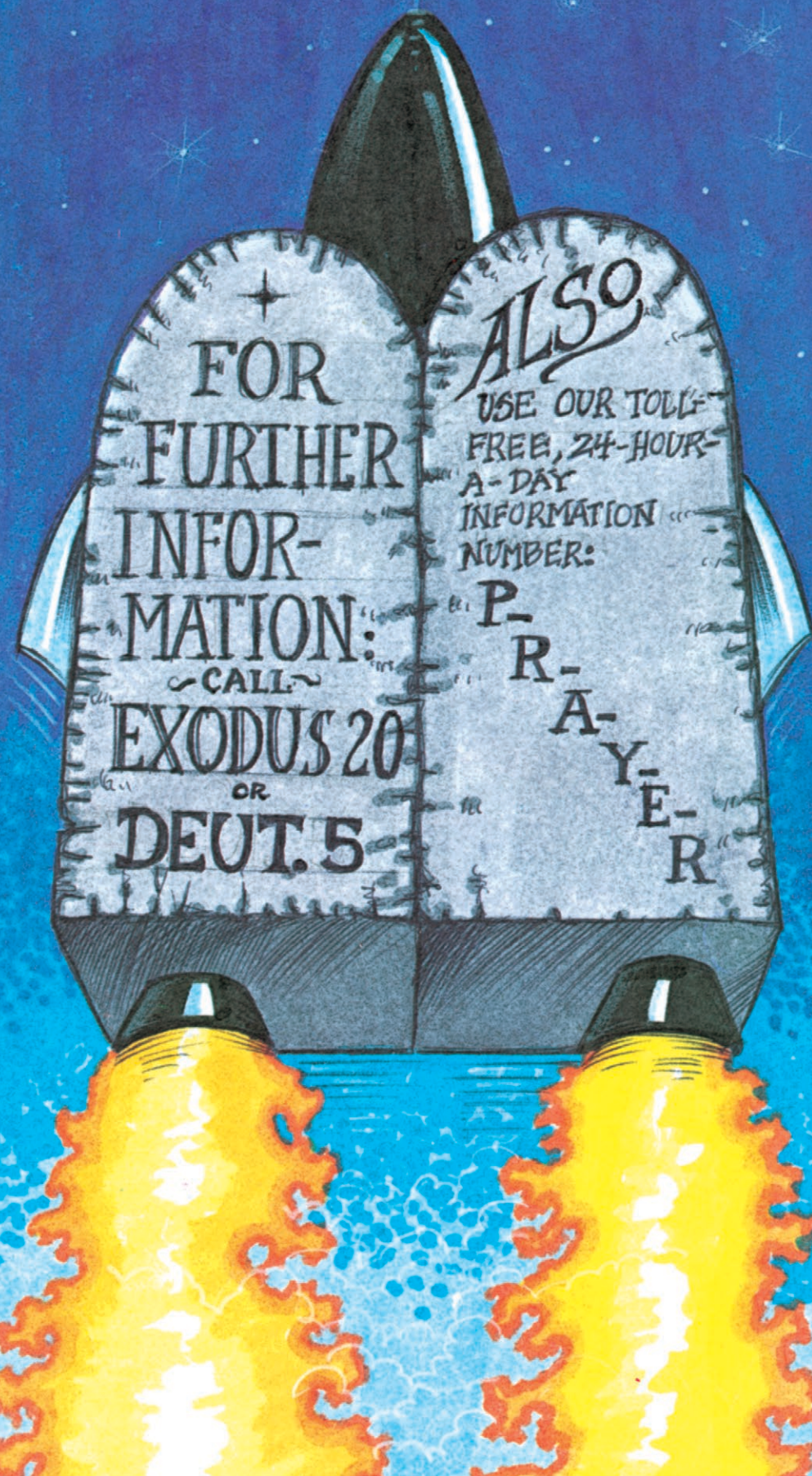

2.

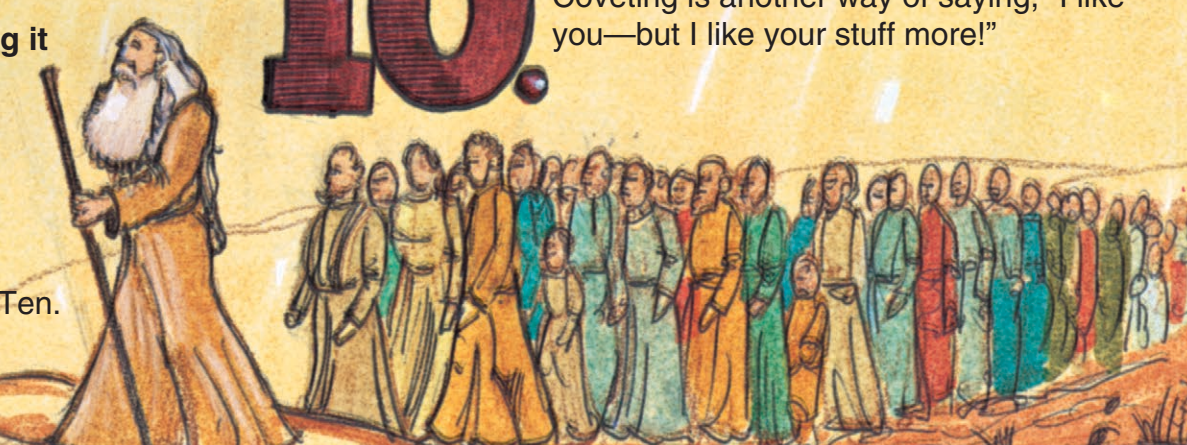
You shall not make for yourself an image in the form of anything You shall not bow down to them or worship them.
