

Pastor Nominating Committee

The Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) was elected by the congregation on Dec 9, 2021 and began work soon after the start of the new year. We have held 11 meetings thus far, trying our best to hold them weekly. Like all of you, we members of the PNC are excited about the prospect of calling a new pastor and look forward to the day when we can introduce our new pastor to you. Until that day, we will be keeping you informed of our progress. This is our first report to the congregation.

As you might surmise, the process is neither easy nor quick. After organizing ourselves, we developed a notional schedule of activities, broken down into seven distinct phases. We are into the third phase at this time, awaiting applications/resumes. The seven phases are:

- 1. Getting organized (assign roles, becoming a Team)
- 2. Telling our story (detailing what CCPC and who we are looking for)
- 3. Fishing for candidate (posting our job announcement and awaiting applications)
- 4. Interviewing candidates (prioritizing and assessing candidates)
- 5. Selecting candidate of choice (down-selecting, making offer, negotiate terms of call)
- 6. Introduction of pastor to church (to Session, to congregation, sign the Call)
- 7. Helping new pastor get started

Our notional schedule is a bit on the aggressive side, deliberately so, our goal being to try and secure a new pastor before the start of the new school year. But, this is all subject to discerning "the" candidate. As it stands now, though, we plan to receive applications through the end of May and start the interview process in early June.

Our denomination is of tremendous assistance with our search. Firstly, our local Presbytery has assigned to our PNC a liaison from their Committee on Ministry. He is Pastor Jay Losher, from the Colesville Presbyterian Church, Silver Spring, Maryland. Secondly, the Presbytery expedited the processing of our 13-page Ministry Information Form (i.e., our want-ad), reviewing it, approving it, and helping to get it posted on the Internet within just a few days of us completing it. And thirdly, providing us access to the PC(USA) website (Presbyterian Church (USA) Church Leadership Connection) where pastors searching can find churches looking, sort of like the jobs website of Monster.com.

As mentioned above, the activities of the PNC are a Team effort, involving the eight elected members below, Pastor Jay Losher, coordination with Session, and the vetting of candidates by the Presbytery. As the PNC Chair, I am privileged to work with this dedicated, laser-focused group of folks - - you did a great job in selecting and electing them! - Mark Pfarrer
