I have had so much fun worshiping with you this summer! We have danced, and sang opening our hearts up to one another and to God. We've spent time asking what moves us? What is authentic to our worship here at CCPC? What stirs from our midst, and what do we have to offer?

We began our journey with Mary (Luke 1:46-55), listening for her song of God's great lovingkindness on the lips of those we have not yet become accustom to hearing, considering what song our lives sing, and finding the courage it takes to say, "I will sing God's song!" We then invited Miriam to point us toward God in song (Exodus 15:1-3, 20-21). Even in the bleakest situations, we ponder what plays the role of her *tophim* (tambourine) in our own lives? A *tophim* can be something or someone that calls attention to God's activity in our own lives and reminds us to trust in God's promises.

It's tempting to turn our hearts off from songs or styles of music or liturgy that we don't prefer or understand. King David's story of dancing before the Ark (2 Samuel 6:12-19) prompts us to draw one another into worship, considering the community. Rather when we feel a twinge of dissatisfaction about a moment in worship, we are invited to turn it into a prayer: "Dear God, may this song [or this liturgy] open someone's heart today. Might your healing love be present through it. And even though I'm not feeling it today, I pray your presence is made known through it. Because friends, if the News is Good, let's dance!

The prophet Jeremiah (9:17-21) tells us that God sings with us. We sing, that we might continue to believe in the power of a God who comes by here (Kum ba yah) in our all our grieving places, and says I am with you. The letter to the Colossians (3:12-16) reminds us of the importance of singing to God, affirming that the practice of singing inside the church helps to root the word of God within us. Because we have sung the rhythms and refrains together, the whole community goes with us into our daily living as they remain on our lips throughout the week.

Last Sunday, inspired by the TAGE On Steel's music, we leapt through beautiful gates (Acts 3:1-10). When we know what makes our hearts sing and spirit leap, we more readily reach out a hand of invitation, welcoming people into what we love about this church that we love.

We have two more Sundays in our *Music that Moves Us* series. Join us online or in person for worship with the music and liturgical style of Taizé on August 6, and as we conclude the series August 13th celebrating sacrament of Baptism and reflecting on the way in nature we hear God's own music (Matthew 14:22-33).

Through this whole series and beyond, we invite every CCPC member and friend to ask, what gifts do *I have to share* to participate in this thing we do here on Sundays called worship? (My voice, my presence, committing to robustly singing every song, ushering, liturgizing, there are so many ways to participate!) And how might I—and this church—be transformed by lifting those gifts up to God?

On June 19, 2023 your CCPC Session unanimously voted to discontinue providing building space to *For-Profit Organizations*. The ramification of this decision is that we have discontinued our use agreement with *Imagine Yoga & Wellness*, *LLC*. This decision was not taken lightly and comes from prayerful consideration and review of our history and legal agreements, tax liabilities and potential financial risks posed to the church by hosting a LLC in the church building, where we exist as a tax-exempt organization.

Our building is a resource to serve the mission and ministry of CCPC, and we look forward to establishing new relationships with nonprofit organizations.
