

Mid-Year 2023 **Pledge Status**

As the summer draws to a close and our thoughts shift to back-to-school and the long Labor Day weekend, the Finance Committee is taking this opportunity to thank you for your generous giving during 2023 and asks you to review your 2023 giving to CCPC. At the beginning of the year 60 persons or families pledged to give a total of \$264,220 during 2023. While this was an increase from 2022, it was still below pre-pandemic commitments and not enough to forestall forcing CCPC to dip into the finite endowment funds. All pledged contributions, and contributions not designated to other specific uses or funds, are credited to the CCPC general operations fund. The CCPC general operations fund pays for salaries, utilities, supplies, and general church operations.

The pledged collections for 2023 totaled \$143,168 as of August 1, 2023. This is 81% of the prorated total 2023 pledge as of August 1. We are most grateful for an additional \$82,221 collected through August 1, 2023 for general church operations from persons or families who chose to not pledge for 2023. We are also thankful for those of you who accepted Evonne Tang's challenge to give another \$9.99 more per month. If the current giving patterns continue the deficit in meeting the annual pledge contribution goal could total as much as \$55,000 by the end of the year. The status of pledged giving, normalized as of August 1, 2023, is shown in the table below.

Pledge Status	Percent of Pledges
Given their full annual pledge or are within one month or less of their 2023 cumulative pledge	57%
Giving has fallen more than a month behind the 2023 cumulative pledge	35%
There has been no giving for calendar 2023 toward the annual pledge	8%
Total	100%

The Finance Committee urges you to consider paying your CCPC pledge using automatic payment either through your bank or through the CCPC online payment vendor Vanco. Another alternative for those who are collecting Required Minimum Distributions (RMD) is to defer part of their RMD to a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) to fund all or part of your annual pledge.

We recommend speaking with your financial and tax advisors before doing a QCD. The Finance Committee can provide you a mid-year contribution summary upon your request. If you desire a mid-year contribution summary speak to Bill Radden-Lesage (301-996-5871) or email ccpconline@aol.com.
