

Seeing Mission in New Ways

Our church was founded with an intention and passion for mission, enjoying a long history of mission work and social justice. From active participation in the Civil Rights Movement in the 1960's, to Honduras, Mexico, Appalachia, and locally supporting our neighbors as "Christmas Families" we've served God in active hands-on ways. This kind of mission work helps us feel like we are "DOING" something, rolling up our sleeves and partnering with God in a tangible way. This kind of mission can be life-changing and faith-shaping. In fact, hands on mission trips and international church partnerships were essential in my call to the ministry! I was on a church trip in the Gulf Coast with Presbyterian Disaster Assistance when I decided to go to Seminary (school for pastors).

But just because we can't "SEE" the fruits of labor from a mission trip, or direct service project, doesn't mean that we aren't DOING mission at CCPC. Yes, the way we have been able to engage in mission in the past few years has changed due to many factors (covid, pastoral transitions, aging trip leaders). When we ask, what breaks God's heart in our neighborhood? We seem to have identified a passion for the kind of mission work that seeks to meet the needs for underserved, and unhoused neighbors, as we have been focusing our efforts on helping individuals and families in need.

In response to several homeless individuals finding us on Sunday mornings, we developed a Mission Shepherd of the Day volunteer opportunity, to attend to folks in need who may come for worship or seeking assistance. The "Shepherds" are equipped to support walk-in needs with a compassionate listening ear, shower bags prepared with toiletries and towels, food cards, or help with whatever may arise that day. Additionally, we have had individual requests for more substantial assistance. Because of this, the Mission committee has created an application and process for individual vetting.

We continue to support our local Warm Nights program by providing food and lunches for unhoused neighbors. We look forward to strengthening our partnership with Community Crisis Services, Inc. (CCSI), as we re-open Hudson House, and provide short term shelter for 1 or 2 individuals at a time. CCSI provides the kind of wrap around support needed to re-house people, and we have the space that can help! Please stay tuned for further ways you can support both of these missions—you were already so generous in your giving over the summer as we sought to raise funds for the renovation.

We continue to support various mission programs, in small ways, and pray that we will be able to return to some of our more visible efforts in future seasons, like training and sending a Living Waters Team, Habitat for Humanity projects, or other partnerships that we have yet to establish! You will find upcoming mission opportunities elsewhere in this newsletter.
