Thank you for your involvement in the CCPC family over this past year. Your very presence has an impact in how we continue to worship and serve God, in this thing we do together called church. Your time, energy, prayers, and financial contributions were critical in helping us grow as a community of faith that we might share the love of Christ with one another, and beyond our walls.

As we look ahead to the 2024 year, we can report a fantastic response to our *Entrusted Treasures* stewardship campaign, with 66 pledges committing \$279,920 to CCPC's mission and ministry. This is the highest number of pledges we have received since 2019. Those numbers include several first-time pledgers, and 60% of you increased your pledges! I am overjoyed by the trust and commitment you feel to this community of faith and am honored that you have entrusted CCPC with your spiritual life and growth. As we peer into the next year, I feel grateful for you, and am excited about what we might do together in Christ's name.

Do you remember back in February, during our annual meeting when our finance chair gave a compelling report encouraging us to increase our giving by \$9.99 a week in order to help balance our 2023 operating budget? The budget projected a \$97,113 deficit for the year. Because of your generosity during 2023, we have decreased that projected deficit. We do have a way to go if we'd like to end our year balanced. If you are experiencing a season of abundance at year's end, we greatly appreciate any increased contributions in December to help us **Close the Gap (CTG)!** Any contributions over your 2023 pledge will be compiled into our year end CTG push.

Acolyte Training

Offering Envelopes Time to make your request 2024

It is that time of year to consider if you desire to have offering envelopes for next year, calendar 2024.

CCPC will continue to recycle from our

inventory of unclaimed offering envelopes from past years. It is a labor intensive job to recycle offering envelopes, but it saves the church lots of money when compared to the purchase of hundreds of preprinted boxes of offering envelopes that are never claimed. It is most efficient to recycle as many boxes of offering envelopes as possible all at one time. Therefore, if you desire to have offering envelopes for calendar 2024 ready for pickup at church by Dec. 31, we need your written request by Friday, Dec. 22, 2023. You can make your request by dropping it in the offering plate or in Financial Secretary mail box in the church office or by US Mail to the church office or with an email to ccpconline@aol.com. We will honor all requests for offering envelopes received after December 22, but as of now cannot provide a certain date for delivery.

Per Capita

At the beginning of each calendar year the National Capital Presbytery (NCP) assesses a fee to all the churches within the Presbytery that allows each church to connect and participate in the wider work of the Presbyterian Church. The assessment is based on the reported church membership multiplied by the Per Capita fee. To offset the budget impact of this assessment, CCPC is asking the membership to make a one-time special contribution to pay the 2024 Per Capital fee for themselves and other family members that are members of CCPC. You can make your Per Capita contribution with cash, check (payable to CCPC), or through the online payment portal (https://secure.myvanco.com/L-Z3Y3/home). Make sure your contribution is clearly labeled that it is for payment of the 2024 Per Capita fee.

The Per Capita fee for calendar 2024 is \$48.56 per member.

Hudson House


We are almost ready to re-open Hudson House! Mission Committee's hope is to provide a temporary housing situation for someone in need coordinated through CCSI.
